

# PROBUS CLUB OF WHITE ROCK & SOUTH SURREY General Meeting Wednesday Jan. 12, 2022



Our January guest speaker was Surrey Police Service Chief Norm Lipinski is an accomplished and highly respected policing leader with over 42 years of experience serving in large, urban municipalities. With a strong reputation as a community-focused leader, Lipinski has a proven track record of championing progressive policing policies geared at deescalating conflict, including diverse perspectives, and increasing police

#### accountability.

Lipinski's in-depth understanding of the City of Surrey is informed by his 5 years serving as Deputy Chief in the neighbouring Delta Police Service, where Lipinski played a key role in devising and implementing effective crime reduction strategies. His understanding of large urban settings is further cemented by his 32 years of experience as Deputy Chief of the Edmonton Police Service in Canada's fifth largest municipality.

Having served as an Assistant Commissioner in the RCMP, Chief Lipinski is uniquely equipped to help steer Surrey through its transition from the RCMP to a municipal policing model.

Lipinski's achievements include receiving the Officer Order of Merit (OOM) bestowed by the Governor General of Canada, the Canadian Police Exemplary Medal, and the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee medal. His educational background includes a Bachelor of Laws Degree (LLB) and a Master of Business Administration (MBA). New Surrey Police Chief Norm Lipinski says he knows he faces many challenges but it suits his temperament. He said, "I enjoy building winning teams. It's a great job for me."

Lipinski, who served with municipal police forces and was a high-ranking officer in the RCMP said the Surrey Police Service now has 200 total staff including 159 police officers recruited from the RCMP, several municipal forces in BC and from outside the province. He said there are recruits from 17 different jurisdictions including Toronto, Calgary and Edmonton. Chief Lipinski says he would rather recruit experienced police officers because it takes almost a year to put a newlytrained officer on the street.

SPS members have been partnering with Surrey RCMP officers since November, 2021 and have attended about 1,000 calls. He said members of the public are not concerned which uniform a police officer is wearing; it's a matter of just getting the job done.

The chief said the SPS has reached out to focus groups in each of Surrey's five districts, conducting about 100 interviews. That may result in slightly different models for each community. Overall he said the number one concern is gang violence. He said in facing that issue the focus will be on youth to hopefully dissuade them from joining gangs in the first place. He said, "Once you get in (to a gang) it's hard to get out."

Although policing has evolved, Chief Lipinski made reference to the vision of Sir Robert Peel, founder of London Police in 1887 who stressed the importance of community involvement. In today's environment Lipinski is looking at the prospect of having trained professionals in the health care field working with police officers. He noted the New York Police Department is experimenting with having psychologists involved in handling "wellness" calls where mental health may be an issue.

Although there could be changes in the municipal election later this year Lipinski says it would not affect his police force since SPS does not report to city council.

It reports to the Surrey Police Board which was appointed by the Provincial Government. The mayor is automatically chairman but does not have a vote unless it is to break a tie. Noting that 200 people have been hired, there is a union contract and \$53 million has been spent including \$15 million on infrastructure, Chief Lipinski said. "You can't un-ring the bell."

It was a lively session with questions from many members, indicating keen interest.
