Golf Group

If you want to be aware of what is going on with the Golf Group and receive the messages that I routinely send out to our golfers, usually monthly, then you need to advise me to put you on my mailing list. You don't need to commit to playing golf.

The Golf Group played at Surrey Golf Course on Thursday, June 30, and the experience was a very pleasant one for those participating. As has been the case in the past, the food & beverage service following golf was very popular.

The golf event for July will in fact be our <u>Annual Probus Club Golf</u>
<u>Tournament</u> and will take place at the Surrey Golf Course, this time playing on the Willows 9 hole course, on <u>Thursday July 28</u>, starting at 3:00 PM. Green fees will be \$20, tax incl. and golf carts [ride-on] will be available for those requiring them. A detailed notice of this event will go via email to all Probus members imminently. The event will be managed by Frank Palmer and Brian Sullivan. Interested participants should contact the coordinator via email.

The Probus Club Golf Group is a group of members who have identified a desire to take part in some golf activity with other members during the summer months, or at least be made aware of the current and ongoing golfing activities, even though they may not actively participate on a regular basis. Being part of the Golf Group does not require any member to participate in any of the events. No costs are involved in being part of the Golf Group. Costs are incurred only when members participate in a specific event, i.e. green fees, cart fees, etc.

At the start of the season, the Coordinator canvasses all members to determine who wants to be part of the Golf Group for the year. Only members of the Golf Group receive the emails/notices throughout the year as to the specifics of planned golf activities. The only exception to this is the Annual Probus Club Golf Tournament, for which notices and information goes out to all club members.

The normal golf day is the 4th Thursday of each month [identified on the Club Activities Calendar], with group members being advised of each event approx. 2-3 weeks in advance by the coordinator, with follow-up calls for involvement up to a few days before the event. The 'go-to' location has become Nico Wynd Golf Course in recent years, however for 2022 that has been altered somewhat due to major on-site re-construction of the clubhouse which has hampered the usual social gatherings following golf; as a result we have begun attending at other local course which offer 9 hole bookings.

I look forward to hearing from you and seeing you at 'the Village Pub'.
























Creator Of Maxine



John Wagner, Hallmark artist since 1970, says Maxine was inspired by his mother, his maiden aunts and his grandmother, the woman who bought him art lessons when 'fill in the pumpkins' was about the extent of his art classes at St John's Catholic School in Leonia, N.J

John remembers doodling as a preschooler and says both his grandmother and his mother encouraged his artistic interests. He eventually attended the Vesper George School of Art in Boston and landed at Hallmark as part of a new artists group. But it was the birth of the humorous Shoebox Greetings (a tiny little division of Hallmark) in 1986 that added a new dimension to John's professional life. The Shoebox way of seeing the world unleashed his talents and he created Maxine.

Why the name 'Maxine'? 'People at Shoebox started referring to the character as 'John Wagner's old lady,' and I knew that would get me into trouble with my wife,' John says. The Shoebox team had a contest among themselves to name the character and three of the approximately 30 entries suggested 'Maxine'. John says the name is perfect.

John, who says he's humbled by such acceptance of Maxine, admits he's proud of her. Now you know the story of how Maxine came to be.
