eyes open for the link you don't want to be looking for it just before the session starts.



At the Club's monthly meeting held on 13th May Steve Banham coordinator of the sub group summarized the plans agreed by the Management Committee for the re-

opening of various activities



Steve confirmed that the overall direction will be to follow the restrictions and Guidelines provided by the Provincial Health Officer and the BC Centre for Disease Control. We will also consider the direction taken by similar groups such as other Probus Clubs and walking groups. We continue to monitor the situation as it evolves.


